Descendants of Isaac Hawes, Jr.

Isaac Hawes, Jr. was the youngest of the seven children of Isaac Hawes, Sr. and his wife Mary Coghill, of Essex Co., VA. His oldest brother Samuel's sons, William & Spencer; Isaac, Jr.; and the orphaned sons of his brother John's first marriage; along with all their families, migrated to Lincoln County, Georgia and the Edgefield District of South Carolina, beginning in 1797. Their descendants still live in the South, in Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Texas, and by now in other areas of the U.S.

Helen Hawes Hudgins, when doing research for her book, "The Richard Hawes Family of Kentucky", contacted many Isaac Hawes, Sr. descendants. Some have been members of our Hawes family association for years. Because of that, and to help all of us to know our cousin's families better, pages 5 & 6 have the family tree of Isaac Hawes, Jr., carried to his grandchildren. This website was established by Forrest Hawes, with content furnished by Joe D. Hawes; both live in Texas and are descendants of Hugh Walker Hawes, son of Richard & Clary Walker Hawes of Kentucky.

The site includes an interesting and short history of Matagorda Island and our Hawes family's struggles there. It describes briefly the "taking" of the land by the United States government in 1940. Many pictures are included at the website and most are in color.

Hugh Walker Hawes was born in Caroline County, Virginia; he moved to Kentucky with his family, at the age of twelve. In his mid-fifties and after the death of Juliette, his first wife, he brought his second wife Corilla, and the children of both his marriages to land on the northeast end of Matagorda Island, that he purchased from the, then new, State of Texas. He had traveled there to scout the area as early as 1839 and recognized its potential as a seaport and for grazing stock. That location is in Calhoun, County, but in the past it was a part of both Refugio and Aransas Counties.

Hugh Walker Hawes is buried on Matagorda Island in a family cemetery and he has many Texas descendants. Charles Theodore Hawes, his eldest son, returned to Kentucky where he married, lived in Hawesville and had many children. Anna Hawes Greaves, one of the descendants of Charles Theodore was a co-founder of our Hawes Family Association.

Joe D. Hawes is the great-grandson and Forrest is the great-grandson of Hugh Walker Hawes. Joe lives in Port O'Connor, Texas, spending most of his time at his ranch in Tivoli, Texas. Contact Joe D.
