Richard Simrall Hawes, III – July 7, 2005 – St. Louis, Missouri

Richard Simrall Hawes, III, a longtime resident of Ladue passed away on Thursday, July 7, 2005, at the age of eighty years, after a lengthy illness.

Mr. Hawes is survived by his beloved wife of fifty-five years, Christy Johnson Hawes; his children, Christy Hawes Bond, Richard "Dee" Bartow Hawes, Felicite "Lissy" Hawes Pollnow, and Eleanor "Chachie" Hawes Brennan; fifteen grandchildren; four great-grandchildren, and his brother Frederick Lee Hawes.

Richard Simrall Hawes, III was preceded in death by his daughter, Laura Marion Hawes and his great-granddaughter, Julia Clark Whelan.

A Funeral Mass was celebrated at the Church of the Annunziata, 925 Cella Rd. at Clayton Rd., Ladue, on Monday, July 11, 2005, at 11:00 a.m., with Reverend Monsignor Richard Stika presiding.

Lucius Powhatan Hawes, born March 21, 1911, died October 12, 1998, was the son of George Bright Hawes (1881-1957) and Laura Simmons Little Hawes (1883-1956); his siblings were Colonel Benjamin Walker Hawes, III (1909-1988), George Bright Hawes, Jr (1915-1922), and Holloway Steele Hawes (1917-1991). Powhatan Hawes married Gladys Van Polt Dutrow; and their children are: Lucinda Hawes Rogers, Lucius Powhatan Hawes, Jr., Jonathan Dutrow Hawes, Martha Hawes Echt, and Jeanette Hawes. He was the great-great-grandson of Richard & Clary Walker Hawes.

Our lifetime association member, Dr. Catherine "Kitty" Hawes Coleman Seaman, of Rockford Farm, Faber, Virginia requested Powhatan Hawes' addition as a memorial member.

Kitty Seaman wrote, "I'll always remember the visit with the two Hawes brothers. They took my sister and me to dinner; as I remember one of the brothers, Colonel Benjamin Hawes, had a very sick wife and I think he had a wooden leg (the lower part of his leg) from an accident in the Army in North Africa; the other brother, Powhatan, went to a college near me, (VMI?) where he was THE horseback equestrian. I fell in love with both of them." "I think it was Powhatan who took us to the family graveyard." She speaks of the Hawes Family Cemetery, in Yelvington, Daviess County, Kentucky.

All of the children of George Bright & Laura Simmons Little Hawes will now be association memorial members.

Richard Simrall Hawes, III, born June 27, 1925, died July 7, 2005. See more about this association elder on page 5.

Laura Marion Hawes, born November 19, 1954, died August 30, 1984, in an automobile accident in St. Louis County, Missouri. She was the daughter of Richard Simrall Hawes, III and his wife Marie Christy Johnson Hawes. Laura died young, but in her short life she graduated from Lindenwood College, was successful in business and as a volunteer in her community. Her family referred to her as the glue; the one whom always remembered the occasions important to them, and frequently organized their celebrations.

Christy Hawes Bond arranged to have her father, Richard Simrall Hawes, III, and her sister, Laura Marion Hawes, honored as memorial members of our family association.

Sister Mary Perpetua Hawes was born Mary Bertha Hawes on September 27, 1924, in Calhoun County, Texas. She died May 22, 2003 in Victoria, Texas. She, as her brothers Alfred Walker "Pat" Hawes and Hugh Adrian Hawes prior to her, died from cancer.

Sister Perpetua entered the convent to become a Catholic nun, a member of the Sisters of the Incarnate Word and Blessed Sacrament, when she was eighteen. She served in many ways during her years with the Incarnate Word Sisters, including as a teacher and as the Mother Superior of her order.

Her parents were Alfred Edwin (1889-1958) & Mary Josephine "Phenie" Johnson Hawes (1891-1972). She wrote a book about her mother titled, "Phenie", including many Hawes and Johnson family anecdotes. Richard & Clary Walker Hawes were her great-great grandparents.

Elizabeth McCoy Hawes, widow of Hugh Adrian Hawes and Sister Perpetua's sister-in-law arranged for her memorial membership.

William Marshall Hawes was born September 5, 1902 and died February 10, 1962 and **Parrilee Lane Hawes** was born September 9, 1910 and died July 3, 2000. They were married June 10, 1945 and had one child, a daughter, Vicki Lane Hawes, born in 1950. Parrie was a longtime correspondent of Helen Hawes Hudgins and they exchanged Hawes genealogical information for many years during their lives. Parrie was also the mother of Betty A. Miller and Violet Miller, from her first marriage.

The ancestry of William Marshall Hawes follows: He was the son of Samuel Bruce Hawes (1866-1909); Samuel was the son of John Franklin Hawes (1832-1890);

John Franklin was the son of Horace B. Hawes (1799-1871); Horace the son of Alexander Hawes (1770-1883); Alexander the son of Samuel Hawes (1739-1786); Samuel was the son of Isaac Hawes, Sr. (c1717-1789); Isaac, Sr. the son of Samuel Hawes I and his wife Elizabeth Anne Spencer, of Caroline County, Virginia.

Vicki Lane Hawes, their daughter, arranged for their memorial memberships.

Richard Simrall Hawes, III (1925-2005)

Richard Simrall Hawes, III was born on June 27, 1925, in St. Louis, Missouri; he was married to Marie Christy Johnson, at St. Peter's Catholic Church, in Kirkwood, Missouri, on July 1, 1950. They were the parents of five children; Christy (Mrs. Dick Bond); Richard Bartow, married to Nancy Wright Wardlaw; Felicite (Mrs. Fairfax Pollnow); Laura Marion Hawes; and Eleanor (Mrs. William Brennan, Jr.).

Richard was an early supporter of the Hawes Family Association and work done at the Hawes Family cemetery, in Yelvington, Daviess County, Kentucky. He participated in our Hawes DNA study. His parents were Richard Simrall Hawes, Jr. (1899-1961) and Marion Fredericka Lemp Hawes (1900-1962). He died July 7, 2005, after a lengthy illness; he was the great-great-great grandson of Richard & Clary Walker Hawes.

There is enough information about this fine Hawes man to fill a book. Deciding what information to include is difficult. Perhaps some of the words spoken by his only son, at his funeral service, will give you a glimpse at this wonderful man and how beloved he was.

Richard Bartow Hawes said, "Pop had a long and full life, and was grateful for it. In one of our many discussions (i.e. training sessions) Dad would give me words to live by. One of the best was; "You can always judge a man's wealth by the friends he surrounds himself with". Looking around, I can see Dad was a very prosperous man indeed. Thank you all his dear friends, for being here today."

"Dad grew up in the Depression, graduated from Country Day, joined the Navy and subsequently got his masters in plastics engineering from Princeton. Over the next 40 years he built KSH into a multi-national chemical company and leader in extruded sheet production. His civic and business life were important to him, and where he met and enjoyed many great friendships along the way."

"Dad loved Mom, his family and friends, but Mom was his inspiration and glue, the joy to get things done -- to keep going through good times and the bad. Like every family we've had our share of tough times and Dad would say, "Circle the wagons". Well, Dad, we are circling them one more time for you."

Hawes DNA Study Update

Bentley Hause lives in Cameron, Milam County, Texas. He was born November 16, 1927. The Hause family came to Milam County in about 1885, when Monroe Hause migrated there with his wife and children from Macon County, Alabama.

Jack Scarborough, Bentley's nephew, along with his wife Iryna lives in Victoria, Texas. After responding to a "Hause-Haws-Hawes" query Jack made to one of the online message boards, and learning that he had a living Hause surname uncle, his uncle Bentley Hause was contacted and agreed to participate in our Hawes DNA study. Since our study includes several Hawes lines, it was hoped that Bentley and Jack would learn more about their Hause family ancestors eventually.

Bentley's 37-marker test results were returned to Family Tree DNA, from the University of Arizona laboratory, in November. Much to the surprise of all of us, we learned that Bentley Hause (pronounced just as we pronounce Hawes) is an exact match in the first 12-markers to: Joe D. Hawes of Port O'Connor, Texas; Richard Simrall Hawes, III of St. Louis, Missouri; William E. Hawes of Leonardtown, Maryland; and Jesse N. Hawes, Jr. of Chesterfield, Virginia. The first three are descendants of Samuel Hawes II and the last is a descendant of Isaac Hawes, Sr.; all of them descend directly from Samuel Hawes I, of Caroline County, Virginia.

Mr. Hause also matched on almost all of markers 13 through 37. The matches prove a common ancestor. What an exciting surprise.

The big question now is where does Bentley Hause fit into our family tree? Because the newsletter is printed in black & white, you cannot see that some of the marker number headings are in red, on the chart. Red print is the way the chart identifies fast-mutating markers. I have placed a small "x" at the top of the columns, where the headings are in red, on the original copy. You will see that with the exception of the fast-mutating **marker 458**, Bentley matches Jesse N. Hawes, Jr. exactly; therefore it is most likely, I believe, that Bentley descends as does Jesse, from Isaac Hawes, Sr., whom is the oldest child of Samuel Hawes I.

Having said that, let me add that Bentley Hause differs from William E. Hawes on only the two fast-mutating **markers 458 & 570**; and differs from Joe D. Hawes by those two and a third, the slow-mutating **marker YCA II a**; and differs from Richard Simrall Hawes III by three fast-mutating **markers 458, 456 & 570**.

Bentley Hause belongs in our family. I have an extensive amount of Virginia Hawes line family tree information, but I cannot find his place in that tree. He and his nephew Jack Scarborough have furnished a great deal of information, going back to his great-great grandfather, Barnett (possibly William Barnett) Haws, born in Georgia in about 1800. **Our initial goal is to find Barnett's parents.**

I have not yet met with Bentley Hause or Jack Scarborough in person; I hope to do that soon. Jack & Iryna live here in Victoria. Below I have listed some of the information that I have about their Hause line; sources are shown.

- (1) **Bentley Hause**, born November 16, 1927, Texas, **son of**. (source: Bentley)
- (2) **Eugene "Jean" Hause**, born February 22, 1887, Texas, **son of** (source: Bentley)
- (3) **William Sidney Haws**, born c 1852-3, Alabama, **son of** (1860 Census/1870 Census/1880 Census)
- (4) **Monroe Haws**, born c 1831, Georgia, **son of** (1870 Census, Tuskegee, Macon Co., Alabama / 1880 Census Cotton Valley, Macon Co., Alabama)
- (5) **Barnett Haws**, born between 1800 & 1810 (1830 Census, Clinton, Jones Co., Georgia)
- (6) Georgia Marriages 1699-1944 Record. August 20, 1828, marriage Jones County - **Barnett Haws to Jane Lidia Shurley** [Shown on 1830 United States Census as Siddy Shurley.]
- (7) Georgia Cherokee Land Lottery, Jones County, **Barnett Haws #76**; District: Eleventh District, Second Section, Cherokee; Residence: Baismore's; County: Jones.
- (8) Macon County, Alabama Estate Records 1832-1940; estate of **Barnett Hawes** probated in September 1854, by his executrix, Siddy Haws. (source: Film #2034083, Church of the Latter-Day Saints)
- (9) Based on estate records, at the time Barnett's will was probated, his children of age were: Monroe, Guss, Ann Elizabeth married to James Hill, and Nancy Emaline married to Jefferson Dismukes. His underage children were: James Nathaniel, Sterling, Thomas, William (possibly William Sidney), Louisa Victoria, Americus (female), and John.

"Adventurers of Purse and Person VIRGINIA 1607-1624/5"
