Ola Ann Dierlam Moseley – Austin, Texas

Ola Dierlam Moseley, 81, a longtime member of the Hawes Family Association, died in Austin on December 15, 2005. She was born on October 24, 1924 in Bay City, Matagorda County, Texas, to the late Albert Sidney Dierlam (1899-1996) and Ola Hawes Dierlam (1893-1979). She married Jack Riggs Moseley (1922-1970) in 1950 and their children were Carol Moseley, Margaret Moseley, Jane Moseley, Jack Scott Moseley, Kathryn Moseley, and Kristin Moseley; all living except one.

Ola had two sisters; her sister whom preceded her in death, Peggy Jean Dierlam ; and her sister Sidney Hawes Dierlam McGlothlin of Sunrise Beach, Texas. She was the granddaughter of the late Albert Budworth "Curly" and Martha Avis Cunningham Hawes; William Isaac & Alice Ann Bludworth Hawes were her great-grandparents. There were no formal services.

Virginia Ruth Hopkins Cardwell, 86, of Robinson, passed away on January 1, 2006, in Waco. Funeral services were held on Thursday, January 5, 2006 at Wilkerson-Hatch-Bailey Funeral Home, with the Rev. OLA HAWES DIERLAM (1893-1979)

New Memorial Member

Ola Hawes Dierlam was the daughter of William Isaac & Alice Ann Bludworth Hawes. She was born November 21, 1893, in Calhoun County, Texas; the tenth of their eleven children. Ola Hawes married Albert Sidney Dierlam in September 1921 and they were the parents of three daughters; Ola Ann Dierlam Moseley; Sidney Hawes Dierlam McGlothlin; and Peggy Jean Dierlam. Ola Hawes Dierlam died January 11, 1979, in Bay City, Matagorda County, Texas, and her husband Sidney Dierlam died July 4, 1996, in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas.

The arrangements for this memorial membership were made by her daughter, Sidney Hawes Dierlam McGlothlin, and should have appeared in our November newsletter. This did not appear then, due to my error. My apologies for my mistake.

MORE NEW MEMORIAL MEMBERS

Jesse Marvin Hawes (1921-2005)

Last quarter the obituary for J. Marvin Hawes appeared in our newsletter. He is being added as a memorial member this quarter, by Donna Simcox, our association member of Ivey, Georgia.

He was born in Lincoln County, Georgia; the fifth child of Charles Howard Hawes & Mamie Catherine Hogan Hawes. His father died in 1926 and his mother in 1953. All his siblings preceded him in death, they were his brothers; Henry killed in action during World War II, in France, in 1944, John in 1961, Walker in 1964, and by his sisters; Ava in 1991, and his twin Mildred in 1999.

Marvin Hawes's line back to the first Samuel Hawes (circa 1675-1769) takes more than one path. The lines follow.

First, Jesse Marvin Hawes was the son of Charles Howard Hawes; the son of Walker Leighton Hawes II; the son of Layton Hawes; the child of Walker Hawes (son of Samuel Hawes) and Nutty Hawes (daughter of Isaac Hawes, Jr.); both Samuel Hawes & Isaac Hawes, Jr. were the sons of Isaac Hawes, Sr.; the son of Samuel Hawes I.

Second. Jesse Marvin Hawes was the son of Mamie Catherine Hogan Hawes; she was the daughter of John Calhoun Hogan & Tommie Dora Hawes Hogan; the daughter of James Newton Hawes (brother of Walker Leighton Hawes II, shown in the first line).

J. Marvin Hawes married first Jannelle Cannington, with whom he had two children; Janis Hawes Reynolds, and Jesse Marvin Hawes, Jr.. Second, he married Mary McAvoy Howard. He was survived by his children and wife Mary.

He died at the age of eighty-four, after a long life filled with the family he loved and with his fond memories of being a forester, owning his own sawmill, and providing employment to many. His sawmill is on display in the historical park, Old Lincoln Town, in Lincolnton, Lincoln County, Georgia.

John W. Reynolds (1923-2001) and Avis June Hawes Reynolds (1925-2005)

Avis June Hawes Reynolds was the daughter of Albert Bludworth "Curly" Hawes and Martha Avis Cunningham Hawes. She was known as June and born in Seadrift, Calhoun County, Texas, dying in Bay City, Matagorda County, Texas. Her Hawes grandparents were William Issac Hawes and Alice Ann Bludworth Hawes; her father Curly Hawes was the youngest of their eleven children. She was the great-granddaughter of Hugh Walker & Corilla Calhoun Hawes and the great-great-granddaughter of Richard & Clary Walker Hawes.

June Hawes married John W. Reynolds on January 27, 1945, in Seadrift, Texas. He was born in Port Lavaca, Calhoun County, Texas and died in Bay City, Texas. John & June had two children, Laverne Adelle Reynolds Farmer and Penni Lynn Reynolds Ponder.

Avis June Hawes had both a sister, Laverne Hawes Young and a brother, Albert Ray Hawes. Laverne Hawes Young arranged for the memorial memberships of both John W. & Avis June Hawes Reynolds.

DNA – THE LATEST NEWS

Raymond Jerry Hawes, Ray, recently tested for our Hawes DNA Study; he matched all of our Virginia Hawes line participants. He lives in California and his known family tree follows this report. His ancestor James W. Hawes was born in Illinois in about 1831 and died in the Civil War in 1863.

Ray matched Joe D. Hawes and Jesse N. Hawes, Jr. most closely; he mismatched one of thirty-seven markers with each of them. The mismatch with Joe D. is at the fast-mutating red marker 570; the mismatch with Jesse N. is at the fast-mutating black marker YCA II a.

His results also match Richard Simrall Hawes, William E. Hawes, and Bentley Hause, with a mismatch of only 2 or 3 various fast-mutating markers, in different combinations (456, 458, 570 & YCA II a).

These new matches excite me greatly, especially the matches with Joe D. (Samuel Hawes II descendant) and Jesse N. (Isaac Hawes, Sr. descendant), which are at equal distances (one marker). Joe D. and Jesse N. match each other on all but two of the thirty-seven markers and we know their exact relationship to each other and to Samuel Hawes (circa 1675-1769).

How can Ray be an unidentified descendant of either Isaac Hawes, Sr. or Samuel Hawes II, when he matches both Joe D. and Jesse N. at an equal distance? Do we have a confirmation, at last, that our first Samuel Hawes really did have an uncle or brother; and that Raymond Jerry Hawes descends from that uncle or brother? I cannot understand how Ray can match Joe D. Hawes and Jesse N. Hawes, Jr., each at a distance of one marker (more closely than they match each other), unless this is so.

Bentley House could also connect to our line, in a similar manner.
