### Louis William Hawes - Owensboro, Kentucky

Louis William Hawes, 81, of 223 Abbie Ave., Owensboro, passed away Tuesday, January 23, 2007, at Owensboro Medical Health System. He was born in Claude, Texas, to the late Sam W. and Laura Cobb Hawes. He was a retired electrician with and a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local No. 1701. He attended the Hawesway Christian Chapel and loved to hunt and fish, vegetable garden, and raise cattle. He was such a kind and generous person that he would give anybody "the shirt off his back." Carl, his brother, whom Louis trusted and loved very much, stated that his brother was a "real warrior" to him.

Mr. Hawes was an Army veteran of World War II and a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 696 and the National Rifle Association. He entered the Army when he was 18 and went into battle almost immediately. He was a staff sergeant in Company K, 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion of the 317<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment and served under General George S. Patton. He was a rifleman and was on the frontlines under combat conditions for nine months. His company was reduced to 12 men, including officers, due to casualties during the Battle of the Bulge. He conducted scouting missions, working ahead of the lines and securing information about the enemy. He participated in four major campaigns while serving in the European theater of operations. He was taken from the battlefield twice for injuries suffered, and was once considered missing in action and presumed dead for 21 days. He was also preceded in death by a brother, Sammy G. Hawes, on October 22, 1982.

Surviving is his wife of 59 years, Margaret Green Hawes; a daughter, Dixie Hawes Falk and her husband, Charles G. Falk, Jr., of Bowling Green, Kentucky; two grandsons, Charles Grady Falk III and his wife Tracy, of Estill Springs, Tennessee, and William Louis Falk, United States Air Force, stationed at Kadena Air Force Base in Okinawa, Japan; six great-grandchildren; a brother, Carl W. Hawes and his wife, Clara Hawes, of Owensboro; and three sisters, Elizabeth Anderson of Mooresville, Indiana, Pauline Moreland of Owensboro, and Marcella Bell and her husband, Bob Bell, of Bradenton, Florida.

Services were held at 1 p.m., Friday, at Glenn Funeral Home. Burial followed in Owensboro Memorial Gardens, with military honors presented by the VFW Post No. 696 Honor Guard. Visitation was on Thursday and Friday at the funeral home. Online condolences may be placed at www.glennfuneralhome.com.

### Lieutenant Colonel Tom Houston Brundrett, US Army retired - Killeen, Texas

Memorial services for Col. Tom Houston Brundrett, US Army retired, were held Thursday, September 21, 2006 in Killeen at Crawford Bowers Funeral Home with internment at the Central Texas Veterans Cemetery following the service. Reverend John Dirk officiated. The family visited with friends at the mortuary Wednesday evening, September 20, in Kileen at Crawford Bowers. Colonel Brundrett passed away Saturday, September 16, 2006, at his residence after a courageous battle with cancer. He was 77 years old.

Colonel Brundrett was born in Refugio, Texas, April 8, 1929, to Alsie Houston & Sadie Gale Brundrett, and he attended public schools and enjoyed small town life. His brother Gale and he both rose to the rank of Eagle Scout, in the Boy Scouts. He was a distinguished military student graduating from Texas A&M University in 1950. He made lifelong friends there. Later he attained a MA from Southwest Texas University in San Marcos. He married Yvonne Selen in Giessen, Germany, June 18, 1955.

Tom was called to active duty during the Korean War and his career spanned twenty years with a number of MAAG assignments in Korea, Indonesia, Iran and a tour in Germany. Retiring from the Army in 1971 he taught American history and economics at Killeen High School until 1986.

Tom was a member of St. Andrews United Methodist Church, Military Officers Association of America, and the Killeen Retired Teachers Association.

Family members left to cherish his memory are his wife, Yvonne; two sons Bruce Jay and his wife Susann of San Angelo, Jeff Houston and his wife Susan of Shawnee, Kansas; four grandchildren; a niece; two nephews; and two dear cousins. Tom was preceded in death by his parents and brother; Gale.

#### RESULTS OF HAWES DNA STUDY

What do we know? We know that our Samuel Hawes of Virginia <u>does not</u> connect to or descend from the following lines: (1) Edward Hawes of Dedham, Massachusetts, circa 1616-1687; (2) The Hawes Family of Ipswich, Suffolk County, England, traced back to the fourteen hundreds; (3) Edmond Hawes the cutler, whom came to Yarmouth, Massachusetts on the ship James in 1635, and was the father of John Hawes, whom married Desire Gorham; (4) Richard Hawes of Dorchester, Massachusetts, whom came from England on the ship, True Love, in 1635; and (5) John Hawes of Maryland, circa 1791-1874, whom married Sarah Phillips; their descendants migrated to Illinois and John's ancestor was Peter Hawes of Germany.

We know that Bentley Hause of Cameron, Texas and Raymond Jerry Hawes of Elk Grove, California are descendants of Samuel Hawes of Virginia. Bentley can trace his ancestry back to Barnett Haws, born in Georgia, and whom was most likely the son of Claiborne & Sally Pickett Hawes. Claiborne Hawes was a direct descendant of Isaac Hawes, Sr... Raymond can trace his ancestry back to James W. Hawes, born in Illinois and died in Texas. How James W. Hawes connects to our Hawes line we do not know. But based on their DNA test results, both Bentley Hause and Raymond Jerry Hawes are close matches to our Isaac Hawes, Sr. and Samuel Hawes II DNA study participants.

Twenty-six volunteers have tested in our DNA study so far. We have not had a match back to England / Europe for our Samuel Hawes of Caroline County, Virginia Hawes line, so far.

Hugh Walker Hawes (1798-1883) & Juliette De Rion Hawes (c1809-1840)

Hugh Walker Hawes and Juliette De Rion (his first wife) were married in New Orleans, Louisiana, on 09 May 1929. Their children were: John Richard, Charles Theodore, Emma, and Juliette. John Richard died in 1856 and was never married; Juliette died the day she was born in 1840. Emma married George Nicholas and had one child, Emma Juliette, and she died giving birth. Charles Theodore married and had a large family. One of his descendants, Anna Hawes Greaves, was one of the founders of the Hawes Family Association. See the family of Charles Theodore Hawes below.

Washington's highest-rated recruit ever ... The No. 1 prospect in the Best in the West poll compiled by the Long Beach Press-Telegram ... College choice came down to a decision between Washington and North Carolina ... The nation's No. 2 prep prospect in the Bob Gibbons' All-Star Report ... Named preseason second-team High School All-American by Street & Smith's magazine ... Son of former Husky basketball player Jeff Hawes (1972-74) and the nephew of Steve Hawes (1970-72) who was named to Washington's All-Century team ... Steve Hawes was UW's 2006 inductee into the Pac-10 Basketball Hall of Honor and averaged 8.4 points per game over 10 NBA seasons (1974-85).

#### Seattle Prep High School (Seattle, Wash.)

A McDonald's All-American ... Also garnered All-America accolades from Parade Magazine and EA Sports ... Selected to the five-member 2006 USA Today All-USA Prep Basketball first team ... Honored as the 2006 Gatorade Player of the Year for the state of Washington ... Averaged 19.9 points, 11.3 rebounds, 3.1 blocks and 3.0 assists as a senior ... Led the Panthers to the 2006 state Class 3A championship ... The MVP of the state tournament ... Named the Seattle Times' State High School Male Player of the Year ... Averaged 16.5 points, 11.5 rebounds and 2.4 blocks as a junior ... Graduated with a 3.70 grade point average ... Led all scorers with 24 points and added 10 rebounds, leading the United States under-18 men's team to a 104-82 triumph over Argentina in the gold medal game of the 2006 FIBA Americas under-18 Championship ... Averaged 12.0 points and 7.5 rebounds during the tournament ... The U.S. team was coached by Hawes' college coach, Lorenzo Romar ... Debuted for USA Basketball in April of 2006 as a member of the 2006 USA Junior National Select Team that defeated the World Select Team 109-91 at the Nike Hoop Summit in Memphis, Tenn ... Tallied eight points, three rebounds and one assist in 17 minutes.

#### Coach Romar on Spencer Hawes

"We are very fortunate to have who we feel is arguably the best big man in America at this level. He is not only talented, but he has a lot of toughness. We think he embodies everything that Husky basketball is all about. We expect him to make an immediate impact, We have not had someone who can step in and do the things that he does with his size. As a 7-footer, he is able to score on the low block and able to pass the basketball with a good feel. He will definitely be someone that will make an impact as a freshman."
