Purpose

The Purpose of the Association is to continue to collect and preserve family histories of Hawes people and allied families; to share our knowledge of family histories and to strengthen extended family ties. The association was established by Helen Hawes Hudgins and Anna Hawes Greaves in 1989, to include all the descendants of Samuel Hawes of Colonial Virginia. Samuel Hawes I was born circa 1675, and died circa 1769 in Caroline County, Virginia. All family members descend from one of Samuel Hawes's two sons; Isaac Hawes, Sr. or Samuel Hawes II.

2010 Reunion

Newest Memorial Member: Eleanor Pauline Haase Phillips 1917-2008

Eleanor Phillips died on Saturday, 28 June 2008 at the Evanston Hospital just north of Chicago, Ill. She was born 3 May 1917 in Oak Park, Ill., the youngest of three children to Elmer Haase and Virginia Randolph Taylor. Eleanor was the great granddaughter of Jonathan Gibson and Susan Elizabeth Hawes Taylor. Eleanor's father, Elmer, died the day after Christmas 1932 when she was 15. This was a terrible blow for the young Eleanor. There was little money for the family, so they moved into the home of her grandfather, Emil Haase, who helped support the family. The Haase family co-founded the Forest Home Cemetery and Emil ran the cemetery for many years prior to Elmer's death.

Eleanor graduated from Glenbard High School, went to Grinnell College and graduated from Purdue 1940 with a major in science. About three months later, she heard about a new government project at the University of Chicago. She applied and was hired eventually working in the lab and later on



calculations on this "metallurgy" project. This project developed the The Bomb. Eleanor continued the project in Chicago until it closed moving to Oak Ridge and Los Alamos shortly before The Bomb was dropped.

Eleanor married Leslie Phillips on 30 August 1941. He had high blood pressure, so could not go into the service. He spent the war working on his PhD in psychology. June of 1945 they moved to Worchester, Mass. Sons David and Kenneth were born 15 June 1947 and 27 February 1950, respectively. Eleanor took classes at Clark University and received an MS in Biology, later teaching night classes at Clark then ran the biology lab at Quinsigamond Junior College until 1969 when the family moved to Boston. Eleanor took a job working in plant collections at Harvard University.

Eleanor and Leslie separated in 1971 and he moved to Tennessee. Eleanor continued to work at Harvard. In the early 1980s her eyesight started failing due to macular degeneration. By 1993, her eyesight was so poor that she moved to assisted living in Newton, Mass. In 2004 she moved to Evanston, Ill. at the request of her son, David. She suffered a stroke and lost consciousness 23 June 2008. David and Ken were present when she died the following Saturday morning. Eleanor is survived by her son David, his wife Beata, and their two children, Michael and Kieran; and by son Kenneth, his wife, Sandra, and their two daughters, Jessica and Erin. Eleanor was buried near her mother, Virginia, and brother, Richard at the Hawes Family Cemetery, Yelvington, KY
