Purpose

The association was established by Helen Hawes Hudgins and Anna Hawes Greaves in 1989, to include all the descendants of Samuel Hawes of Colonial Virginia. Samuel Hawes I was born circa 1675, and died circa 1769 in Caroline County, Virginia. All family members descend from one of Samuel Hawes's two sons; Isaac Hawes, Sr. or Samuel Hawes II.

Senator Harry Bartow Hawes - New Memorial Member



Harry Bartow Hawes, United States senator from Missouri, was born in Covington, Kentucky, November 15, 1869. Son of Smith Nicholas and Susan Elizabeth (Simrall) Hawes, grandson of Richard Hawes II. He moved to St. Louis in 1887 and was graduated from Washington University Law School nine years later. Immediately starting law practice in St. Louis, Hawes soon became a prominent Democrat. In 1898 he represented the Republic of Hawaii in its fight for annexation to the United States, and the same year he was appointed a member of the St. Louis Board of Police Commissioners. He served four years as president of the board and resigned in 1903 to seek the Democratic nomination for governor, but Joseph W. Folk defeated him. Hawes then began to agitate for good roads and after a period of law practice he served in the state legislature, 1916-17. He was author of the state highway law, known as the "Hawes" law.

When the World War broke out in 1914, Hawes was visiting in Ireland. He went to London where he stayed for two months, studying the development of the war. On coming back to this country, he lectured on international law in answer to German propaganda that was being spread throughout the United States. Hawes again went to Europe in November 1917 and spent seven months in France, England, Switzerland and Spain. When he returned to the United States, he was assigned to the psychologic section of the military intelligence department and sent to Madrid. After the war, during which Hawes became a major, he wrote about his war experiences and, also, his research on the works of Cervantes.

Hawes was elected to Congress from the eleventh district in 1920 and served in the House for three terms. He resigned to become a candidate for the United States Senate after he had been appointed to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Selden P. Spencer. Hawes was also elected for a full term but resigned, February 3, 1933, one month before his term expired. In both the House and Senate Hawes served on the interstate commerce committees and used his influence to promote Mississippi River improvement. He was joint author of the Hawes-Cutting Act, which gave independence to the Philippines at the end of a certain period of time.

Hawes also authored several books on outdoor sports and the Philippine Islands. He practiced law in St. Louis and Washington, D.C., until his death on July 31, 1947.

Below is a genealogy report on the descendants of Smith Nicholas Hawes, father of Harry Bartow Hawes. Five names from the Memorial Membership list are in this report. Thanks to the Richard Simrall Hawes family for establishing a memorial membership for their ancestors. The genealogy report information came from "The Richard Hawes Family" CD.

Descendants of Smith Nicholas Hawes

1. **Smith Nicholas Hawes** was born in 1843 in Kentucky and died in 1891 in St. Louis, Missouri. In 1861 he was a Lieutenant in the Confederate Army. He married **Susan Elizabeth Simrall** in 1868. She was born 2 November 1846 in Madison, Indiana and died 1900 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Children of Smith Hawes and Susan Simrall are:

A. **Harry Bartow Hawes** was born on 15 November 1869 in Covington, Kentucky and died on 1 August 1947 in St. Louis, Missouri. Details of his life are included in the section above. He married **Elizabeth Eppes Osborne Robinson** on 15 November 1899.

Children of Harry Hawes and Elizabeth Robinson are:

i. **Peyton Elizabeth Hawes** was born on 13 November 1900 in St. Louis, Missouri.

ii. **Eppes Bartow Hawes** was born on 11 December 1901 in St. Louis, Missouri.

B. **Richard Simrall Hawes** was born on 15 December 1873 in Covington, Kentucky and died in 1949. He married **Mary Teresa Kemp** on 30 June 1897 in St. Louis, Missouri. She was born in 1876 in Missouri and died 21 August 1921 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Children of Richard Hawes and Mary Kemp are:

i. **Richard Simrall Hawes, Jr.** was born on 18 July 1899 in St. Louis, Missouri, and died 1961. He married **Marion Lemp** on 8 February 1921 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Children of Richard Hawes, Jr. and Marion Lemp are:

a. **Richard Simrall Hawes, III** was born on 27 June 1925 in St. Louis, Missouri, and died 7 July 2005 in St. Louis, Missouri.

ii. **Mary Bartow Hawes** was born on 19 April 1903 in St. Louis, Missouri.

iii. **Robert Nicholas Hawes** was born on 21 August 1904 in St. Louis, Missouri.

iv. **Susan Elizabeth Hawes** was born on 20 June 1907 in St. Louis, Missouri.

- (4) Dr. Pepper Museum and Free Enterprise Institute. Visit original building and sip at the restored soda fountain.
- (12) Art Center Waco and (13) Martin Museum of Art.
- (17 - 22) Visit historic houses.
