

### Albert Horton Foote Jr.



**Albert Horton Foort, Jr.**, Chronicler of America in Plays and Film, was born in Wharton, Texas, March 14, 1916. He chronicled a wistful American odyssey through the 20th century in plays and films mostly set in a small town in Texas and who left a literary legacy as one of the country's foremost storytellers.

Although he boarded a train for Dallas at 16 to pursue acting, Horton never really left home. From his first efforts as a playwright, he returned again and again to set his plays and films amid the pecan groves and Victorian houses with large front porches on the tree-lined streets of Wharton. His inspiration came from the people he knew and the stories he heard growing up there.

Horton Foote spent two years studying acting in California, then went to New York to become a Broadway star. While in New York, the

actors in the acting company were asked to perform improvisations based on life in the actors' hometowns. After Horton performed his, he was asked if he had ever considered writing. He continued acting and appeared in other plays. On a trip home to Wharton, he wrote a three act play set in a small town drugstore called "Texas Town". It was staged in 1941 with Horton in the lead. The play was reviewed by a noted critic, Brooks Atkinson, who stated that Mr. Foote's play is "an able evocation of a part of life in America".

While working in a New York bookstore, he met Lillian Vallish. They married a year later on June 4, 1945. They had four children: Hallie, an actress; Horton Jr., an actor and director; Walter, a lawyer; and Daisy, a playwright.

In 1950, Horton was in New York to help usher in the era of television writing the weekly half-hour episodes of "The Gabby Hayes Show". Shortly after he was on contract to write nine one-hour dramas for television. The third of these was called "The Trip to Bountiful", which starred Lillian Gish as the gentle and long-suffering widow, Carrie Watts. The play would have several incarnations over his life. A 1985 movie starring Geraldine Page received an Academy Award for best actress and Horton a nomination for the screenplay.

Television moved to the West Coast. There Horton's work led to his first film projects. One was the adaptation of "To Kill a Mockingbird", in which he received his first Academy Award. Horton had another film success with "Baby, the Rain Must Fall" (1965) starring Steve McQueen. Then the Hollywood honeymoon soured. He moved to New Hampshire to live on a farm. After the death of his parents, he began the nine-play cycle called "The Orphans' Home". The first of these plays were staged in New York and marked the start of the Foote revival.

While working on "The Orphans' Home", he began working on a story about a group of young singers trying to break into country and western music. The movie "Tender Mercies" was filmed in

Waxahachie, Texas, staring Robert Duvall. It received Academy Awards for best-actor and best screenplay. Horton Foote Jr., died on March 4, 2009 in Hartford, Connecticut, at age 92.

He married Corilla Calhoun (see #10) in 1842 in Daviess Co., Kentucky. He died on 21 Oct 1883 in Matagorda Island, Calhoun Co., Texas, at age 85. He was buried after 21 Oct 1883 in Matagorda Island, Calhoun Co., Texas.
