Letter to Edwin Hawes from Hugh Walker

This letter was written by Hugh Walker Hawes (1798-1883), son of Richard & Clary Walker Hawes, to his brother Edwin Hawes of Kentucky, in 1856. A copy of the original letter was given to me by Texas historian, author, and friend of our Hawes family, Bill Winsor. The town of Saluria was located on Matagorda Island, in Texas. The fact that the United States now finds itself with a shortage of seaports magnifies how far Hugh Walker Hawes was ahead of his time. I am sharing this treasured letter written by my great-great grandfather in 1856.

Joanne Hawes Stoe San Antonio, TX September, 2012

> New Orleans 30 Nov 1856

Dear Edwin:

I arrived here on Mexico [one of his steamboats] and shall return to Saluria by same steamer leaving at 8 O' Clock tomorrow, Sunday.

I have never been so exalted and confident of success as I have become since my arrival here and if my dreams are realized, a success of which I had not dreamed til yesterday.

I cannot go into details lest you consider me ridiculous in case of failure, and since my residence at Saluria there have been so many flattering indications all of which have vanished, that I am mistrustful of things which I feel. As realized.

I left home not expecting to come farther than Galveston to see Walker [Hugh Walker Hawes, Jr.] who is at the Catholic School there and Col. Field the State Superintendent and Director of Works to be done in the Guadalupe River and our Bay to the extent of \$30,000. Which is granted on condition that individuals raise 1/5 the amount which has been done. He promised to return with me and make the reconnaissance at once, which he had not intended doing til Jany [January], and it is expected that the lettings of contracts will take place in Jany, and the work easily commenced. I shall urge the cutting out the bar into our Bayou which will give us a perfect harbor. In addition the Colorado River entering our Bay will be entitled to \$50,000. One fifth of which sum has been raised by the inhabitants making upwards of \$60,000 on the River.

I got a letter from Cousin Theodore Tuesday saying that he and some friends intended to come to Texas. I wrote to him to come directly to Saluria and this is written to urge you to come with him as I should be always pleased to see you but above all in prosperity. Bring Theodore & family with you & if you cannot come urge them to do so. I [hope] all will come.
