First, we have four new members. They are:

We are glad to have them as members. Enrolling the last two (above) is exciting to this writer, inasmuch as they are descended from the last child of Richard & Clary Hawes -- William Franklin Hawes, SR., and wife, Aurelia...my own line from Richard & Clary. Nancy then sent MANY computer sheets of the Nainheim family, so just when I had about decided that Wm. F. Sr. had fewer descendants than any of the children of Richard & Clary, I find his descendants are MANY. All of the new babies who will be announced in their WELCOME TO THE WORLD (later) are descended from W. F. Hawes, Sr.

The Nainheims made a trip to Kentucky...going to Owensboro, Hawesville, Maceo, the Hawes Family Cemetery and they found some "relatives" who were at home, resulting in a huge Love-In for the St. Louis visitors. They also found the Catholic cemetery where W.F. Sr. and wife are buried.

THEN, upon their return home, they found a large box of old photographs of Wm. F. Sr. and his wife, and some of their children. Also, there was a picture of Susan Elizabeth Hawes, dau. of Richard & Clary, who married Jonathan Gibson Taylor. What a tiny little lady was she! All the pictures were titled and they are being copied and used in this Newsletter.

For so many years now I have pictured all the Hawes people as "giants" since they had become my heroes...but from pictures I've seen of the children of Richard & Clary, they are "not large" people -- with the exception of a picture of their first son, Samuel, whose picture was evidently taken in his later years, and he looked a bit "jow-ly" in his face.

Also, in this letter is a picture of Richard Hawes II, re-produced from the original painting of him, now owned by Richard Simrall Hawes III of St. Louis. Dick has said I could use this copy in whatever way I choose, so, thanks to his generosity, we now have a picture of Richard II when he was a young man.

Previously Susan Foster, of Maceo, had sent her mother's records, showing her descendancy from Wm. F. JR. and wife. Now, with her new material and that from the Naunheim people, all the descendants of Wm. F. SR. and wife can have a splendid record of their forbears.

Now, dear Member, will you allow me to give a brief record of Wm. F. Sr.'s family? Please do, because the only son of Wm. F. Sr. who had sons, who would carry on the Hawes name was our grandfather, Edwin Combe Hawes. He and his wife (whom we called "Mammy") had three sons.

I truly thank the Naunheims and Susan Foster.

Now, for the record:

William Franklin Hawes, Sr. and wife, Aurelia (Combe) Hawes had:


1. William Franklin Hawes, Jr., born 1839. Married Ann McAdams. They had:
Aurelia C. Hawes (1863-1915) who married Charles H. Carlton. They had descendants.
William Franklin Hawes, Jr., has remained my Mystery Man; have never been able to find WHEN he died or WHERE he is buried. It is known that his parents sent him to Rome, for education in the Catholic Church. He returned to America, and at some time migrated westward, to Wickliffe, Kentucky. His wife is buried in the Hawesville, Ky. cemetery, and a son, Gibson Taylor Hawes, born July 23, 1865; died August 28, 1865, is buried beside his mother. They are in the McAdams Family lot.
2. Helene Clary Hawes (1842-1915) married Charles W. Kearney of St. Louis. Descendants include the late Estelle and Helene Philibert, sisters.
3. Aurelia Hawes, born 1843/4; married Y. Shrader on 1-7-1863. Resided in Missouri at the time of her father's death
4. Aylett Hawes, born Feb. 1846; died September 1847
5. Ann Hawes (also known as "Fannie" and "Nannie".) Born in 1849. On 4-12-1869 she married Hamilton Williams. They had a daughter, Aurelia Williams who was on the 1870 Census. After the death of her husband, Ann went to St. Louis, and at a double wedding ceremony (when her younger sister Susan (below) married Herman Naunheim) Ann married Mr. Blakely.
6. Albert Gallatin Hawes, born June 1851; died August 1851
7. Amelia Hawes, born 1853. The Hawes Family Cemetery Register shows an unmarked grave carried the name of AURELIA, dau. of W. F. and Aurelia. However, a book entitled "Kentucky Births 1852-1861", gives the entry of "HAWES, CATHERINE, b. 3-21-1853, dau. of W.F. & Aurelia, Hancock County". It is this writer's opinion that Amelia, b. 1853, IS the child in the unmarked grave, with Registration #44 -- she may have had a double name...Catherine Amelia...but I do not think the Cemetery Register is correct in calling her AURELIA. I believe Amelia died young.
8. Edwin Combe Hawes, born in Hawesville, Ky. on 3-19-1856; died in Union City, Tennessee in mid-July of 1928. He married Angela Lillie Morris of Camden, Tennessee, and they had 3 sons
9. Charles W. Hawes, born January 1859; died July July 3, 1859
10. Samuel Hawes, born August 1860; died Jan. 12, 1861
11. Susan Hawes, born 3-17-1862. Baptized in Hawesville, Church of the Immaculate Conception, by Martin John Flynn, Priest, on March 23rd. She married Herman Naunheim, in St. Louis, at a double wedding ceremony -- when her older sister married Mr. Blakely.


