## **Purpose**

The association was established by Helen Hawes Hudgins and Anna Hawes Greaves in 1989, to include all the descendants of Samuel Hawes of Colonial Virginia. Samuel Hawes I was born circa 1675, and died circa 1769 in Caroline County, Virginia. All family members descend from one of Samuel Hawes's two sons; Isaac Hawes, Sr. or Samuel Hawes II.



# A Legacy of Land

The Yelvington Precinct map below is from the <u>Historical Atlas Map of Daviess County, Ky</u>. published in 1876. It shows the location and size of land owned by descendants and spouses of Richard and Clara Hawes.



Richard and Clara Hawes came to Kentucky in 1810. In 1820 he and his wife acquired 3,000 acres of land that extended from Iceland Landing on the Ohio River back to the hills where Kingfisher Lake was later built. In his will Richard gave 300-400 acres each to Ann, Samuel, Hugh Walker, Benjamin, and Alyette. He gave 500-700 acres of Hancock County land to Albert, Edwin and Catherine. Susan received 400 acres upon her marriage to Jonathan Taylor.
